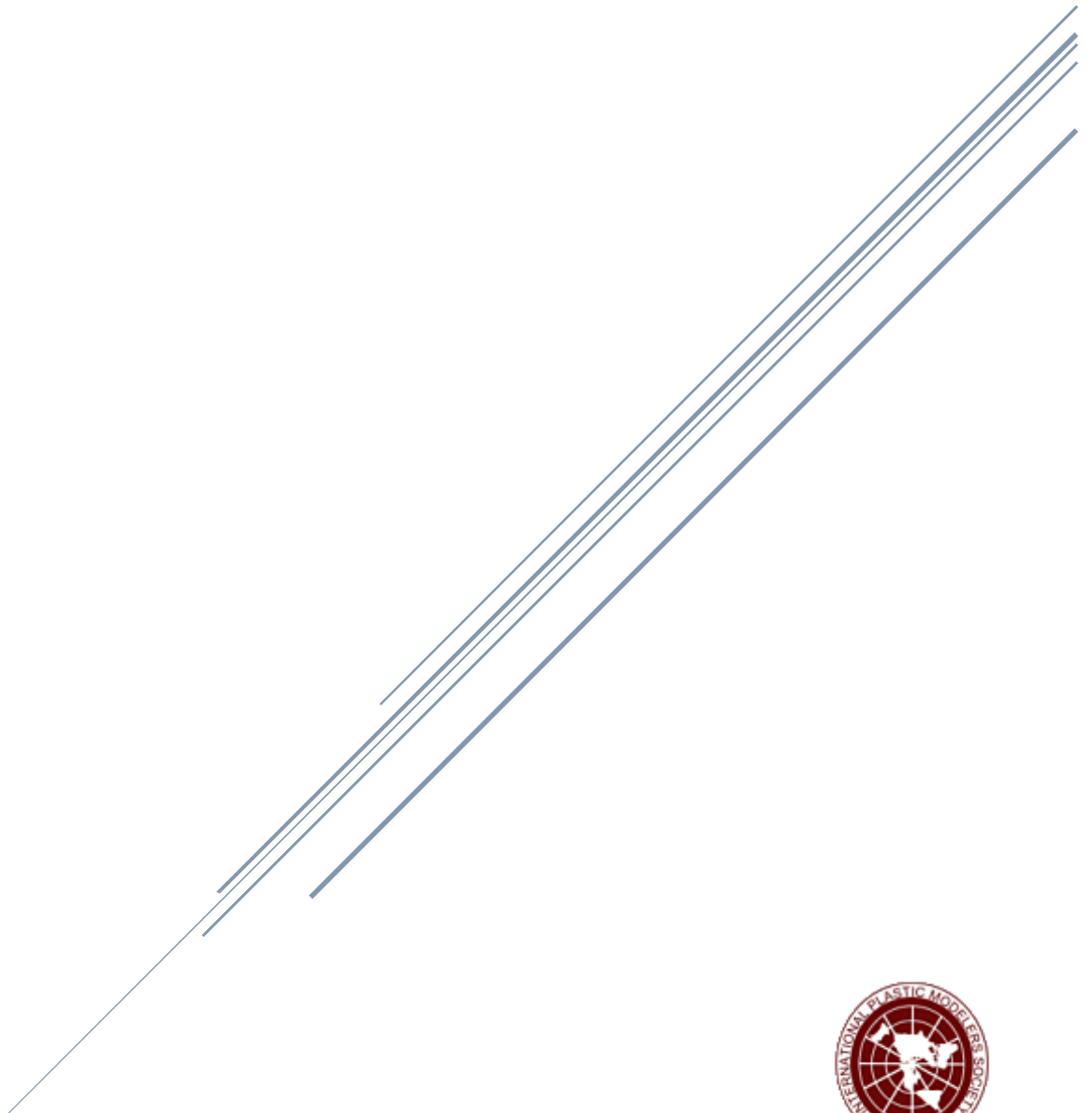

## Overview

---

*On June 25, 2020, the San Marcos 2020 Convention Leadership team and the IPMS/USA Executive Board announced that the 2020 IPMS/USA National Convention to be held in San Marcos, Texas, was canceled due to impact of the worldwide coronavirus pandemic. Concurrently, the decision was made to move the San Marcos convention to 2023.*

---

The 2021 IPMS/USA National Contest was held during the annual convention in Las Vegas, Nevada, on August 18-21, 2021. There were 2,680 total contest entries, making it the fourth largest contest since 1986. Entries were in 205 categories, receiving 599 awards for first, second, and third place within each category. There were 5 additional awards presented for the host chapter's themes, 8 awards for special interest areas, and 12 awards for the best-in-class and overall show awards.

### NCC Judges Seminars

The NCC conducted the annual seminar, "What Judges Look For," on Thursday, August 19, with approximately 35 attendees. This seminar highlighted errors in construction and finishing which might result in an entry not receiving an award, such as misalignment of wings, wheels, unpainted surfaces, etc.

In addition, a one-hour judges' meeting was held immediately prior to the start of the judging process on Friday, August 20. The purpose of this annual session was to reiterate the judging standards and ethics expected of all judges, to review the recording procedures, and to introduce the Class Head Judges.

Judging began at 7:00 pm and concluded with the final Judges' Grand Award decision made by 1:30 am. The recording, photography, and awards presentation efforts continued throughout Friday night and all-day Saturday in preparation for the Saturday evening presentation.

The efficiency of the judging process continues to improve each year, thanks to the hard work and efforts of the Class Head Judges and their support teams in preparing their preliminary decisions on category splits and placement of models into split categories. This preparation has greatly reduced the time required for the judging process.

The IPMS National Registration system developed by Ed Sunder with the Chattanooga Scale Modelers was used again this year, with great success. Access to this database facilitated the editing of the initial contest results data entry, along with the master entry forms submitted during the convention.

## NCC Judge Certification

The judge certification program was initiated in 1990 (31 years ago) by Aris Pappas. Participation and seniority are determined by having the judges sign into a logbook for each year that they participate in judging. On-the-job trainee (OJT) status includes judges in their first through third years of participation. Senior judges are awarded certificates of recognition, along with pins, for 3-, 10-, 20-, and 30-years of participation. While many of the judges participated in contest judging from the inaugural contest in 1964 through 1989, no formal records were maintained for this participation; the current certification program now allows IPMS to recognize service from 1990 forward.

Three-, 10-, and 20-year pins have been provided to judges in prior years, and 30-year pins have been produced for this year's awardees.

There are 1,197 judges in the national judges' roster maintained by the Chief Judge who have participated at least once since 1990. Of those, 660 judges have a "current" status to indicate they have participated in at least one contest within the past 10 years. Of the current judges, 420 (64%) have 5 or fewer years of service; 99 (15%) have 6-10 years of service; and 141 (21%) have more than 10 years of service.

A total of 200 judges participated in the judging this year, including 41 new OJT judges. This year's judging corps represents 1,922 contest-years of accumulated judging experience at national contests.

The NCC recognized seniority in judging by awarding certificates for 3, 10, 20, and 30 years of judging service. This year, newly certified senior judges were presented certificates and pins, as follows:

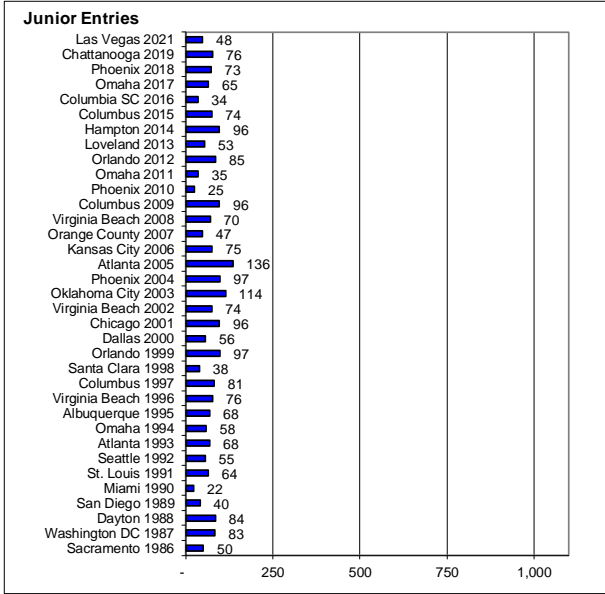

## 2021 Count of Entries by Category

Following is the detailed count of entries by category. A maximum of 200 awards packages for categories and splits were approved by the NCC, which includes five “unplanned” splits. A total of 205 packages were awarded. In addition to the named splits approved by the NCC, 22 new splits were named or created during judging. Three categories were not used (had no entries). The host chapter provided an additional 16 awards packages above the maximum number approved by the NCC; 8 of these packages were used. ## 2021 Management of Split Categories

Prior to each annual contest, the NCC defines categories and potential splits, which results in a total number of awards packages to be purchased by the convention host chapter. Typically, splits are done to divide a high-entry category into sub-categories of like-themed entries – creating a more equitable competition based on the type, size, or theme of the entries. Due to the fluctuation of both the number of entries and the types of entries, flexibility is needed to adjust to each year's contest; and therefore, splits are used, not used, or moved where necessary and named at the discretion of the NCC.

Splits may be named with an expected theme or variant. Named splits are used the same as other categories, i.e., even if the entry count is low, awards are placed. If there are no entries in a named category or split, the awards for that category or split may be used elsewhere, as long as the awards are not preprinted for class and/or category (which may limit their transferability to other classes).

Splits may be unnamed and defined as a “pre-planned” split or as an “estimated additional” split within Classes. As has been done for several years, an additional five unnamed splits were included in the total awards package count to be used if needed in any class. Unnamed splits are not required to be used and are at the discretion of the NCC.

Since 2004, the “no sweeps” rule has been in place, meaning that a person may be awarded only one place (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup>) within a category, regardless of the number of models that individual entered into the category (and therefore could not “sweep” two or three place awards in the category). On occasion, a category may show a high number of entries – but not be split into smaller groups – where there may be multiple entries by individual modelers.

If, and only if, the host chapter has purchased additional awards packages can additional splits be awarded beyond the NCC approved maximum count. Exceeding the total awards packages is not recommended nor required of the host chapter. This year, the Las Vegas host chapter provided 16 award packages above the NCC category maximum count, of which 8 were used.
